This position is a 12 month contract

The job involves some of the following activities, though this list is not considered exhaustive:

- To act as the overall leader for the project, staff members (international and Malagasy) and volunteers and uphold and enforce all regulations and Disciplinary Rules and Procedures set down by the company
- To ensure the project objectives laid down by the company are being fulfilled
- To act on behalf of Reef Doctor.Org Ltd in all dealings with the IH.SM and University of Toliara for the Project and its activities.
- To be responsible for the management of ReefDoctor's Volunteer Research Assistant programme
- To be responsible for maintaining regular contact with NGOs, government ministries, and local institutions to convey our project objectives and achievements
- To work with other NGOs, government ministries and local institutions in collaborative projects and be the person responsible for ensuring that ReefDoctor's responsibilities/duties are fulfilled
- To participate in community liaison with the local villagers and act as the person responsible for the project on behalf of Reef Doctor.Org Ltd.

- Demonstrable Project management experience, including working to tight timescales and with limited budgets
- Managerial experience working with small project teams and the ability to motivate people
- Staff management experience
- Financial planning and accounting skills
- Data analysis skills including using SPSS, PRIMER and Mini-tab
- General computing skills using Microsoft Word, Excel, Access, PowerPoint and Publisher
- Ability to speak, read and write French at an advanced level
- PADI Advanced Open Water certification or above
- Experience working in small teams in isolated, tropical environments
- Driving licence (International)
- Your own full set of dive equipment
- Physically fit with full valid diving medical.
- Adaptable with good practical problem solving abilities
- Ability to work in basic conditions with limited facilities and diet
- Ability to work under pressure to deadlines and within limited budgets.
- Financial ability to pay the cost for your international return flight to Madagascar and one domestic flight to the south of Madagascar (to be reimbursed on completion of your contract)
- Financial ability to cover standard travel, dive and medical insurance
